Dear Friend;

Fifteen years ago, Chabad-Lubavitch of Greater Boynton dropped anchor in an undeveloped region, desolate of Judaism; Boynton Beach.

A fast forward snapshot of all The A-lmighty's blessings since then can be seen from this past holiday season. No less than five separate evening services have spawned from the central Chabad Synagogue into communities of longer walking distance to the Shul.

Hundreds of families have relocated around our six-acre campus. 100 estate homes were built under the direction of Chabad. This was the catalyst for families to become Shabbat and Kashrut observant. Many more relocated around the Chabad center into the area's fledgling residential communities.

Chabad has created a vibrant traditional Judaic life, a sanctification of G-d's name, in a region in which it was simply nonexistent.

The sight Shabbat morning as hundreds of men, women and children stream to Shul, utilizing the city's remarkable 100 square mile eruv, is of sheer delight. Hand in hand, families dressed in their Shabbat finest, walk streets which were simply not paved or lit, before this infrastructure was created. Some 100 children are enrolled in Shabbat children's services.

Another chapter in our people's development has been written. A region of 86,000 Jews has been significantly impacted in their Judaism, by these accomplishments.

Well over 1400 women have visited our luxurious Mikvah since opening three years ago. Our early childhood education center, filled with more than 65 children enrolled, is in dire need of expansion. The roster of adult education classes, crowned by the acclaimed JLI series, continues to flourish, filling each night of the week.
